## DAY 1

### Amazing Faith

*When Jesus heard this, he was amazed. He said to those following him, "What I'm about to tell you is true. In Israel I have not found anyone whose faith is so strong" (Matthew 8:10 NIV).*

The centurion had faith that Jesus could heal his servant. And how did Jesus respond to this man's faith? Read verse 10 for a clue.

## DAY 2

### First Things First

*Wisdom teaches you to have respect for the LORD. So don't be proud if you want to be honored (Proverbs 15:33 NIV).*

Maybe you got that brand new bike you really wanted for your birthday. Sometimes, we have backward thinking, believing that all the good things that happen are because of us. But a wise person knows that everything you are and everything you have comes from God. When you remember to say, "Thank You, God" instead of thinking that you should get all the credit, you honor God and acknowledge that He is most important
